	202. TUITION STUDENTS	
<p>1. Authority</p>	<p>The Lebanon County Career and Technology Center Joint Operating Committee will authorize acceptance of tuition students under the following conditions:</p> <p>That the student requesting tuition status petition the school Joint Operating Committee of their district for written approval to participate at the Career and Technology Center secondary education program.</p> <p>That the tuition student’s school district agree to payment through terms and conditions as outlined in School Laws of the Commonwealth and/or regulations pertaining to same.</p> <p>That participating districts students have priority in selection and placement in instructional areas.</p> <p>That the tuition student furnish transportation to and from the Career and Technology Center.</p> <p>That the Administrative Director recommend the tuition student to the Joint Operating Committee.</p> <p>That the Joint Operating Committee review and take appropriate action concerning the approval of a tuition student.</p> <p><u>ELIGIBILITY OF NONRESIDENT STUDENTS</u></p>	<p>SC 1309, 1847 1850 (23)</p>
<p>2. Purpose</p>	<p>The Joint Operating Committee shall operate the Career and Technology Center for the benefit of students resident in this district who are eligible for attendance.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee may permit the admission of nonresident students in accordance with terms of this policy.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee shall require that appropriate legal documentation showing dependency or guardianship or a sworn statement of residential support be filed with the Joint Operating Committee Secretary before an eligible nonresident student may be accepted as a student in the district schools. The Joint Operating Committee may require a resident to submit additional reasonable information to substantiate a sworn statement, in accordance with guidelines issued by the Department of Education.</p>	<p>SC 501, 502</p> <p>SC 1301, 1316</p> <p>SC 1302 Title 22 Sec. 11.19</p>

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3. Guidelines	<p>The Joint Operating Committee reserves the right to verify claims of residency, dependency and guardianship and to remove from attendance a nonresident student whose claim is invalid.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee shall not be responsible for transportation to or from school for any student residing outside school district boundaries.</p> <p>Tuition rates shall be determined in accordance with statute. Tuition shall be charged monthly, in advance of attendance.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>NONRESIDENT CHILDREN PLACED IN THE DISTRICT</u></p> <p>Any child placed in the home of a district resident by a court or government agency shall be admitted to the schools and shall receive the same benefits and be subject to the same duties as resident children.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>INMATES OF INSTITUTIONS</u></p> <p>A Child who is an inmate of an institution for the care or training of children located within this district is not a legal resident of the district by such placement; but s/he shall be admitted to district schools, without charge.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>FUTURE RESIDENTS</u></p> <p>A student eligible for attendance whose parent has executed a contract to buy, build or rent a residence in this district for occupancy may be enrolled without payment of tuition.</p> <p>Parents of students who claim admission on the basis of future residency shall be required to demonstrate proof of the anticipated residency.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>FORMER RESIDENTS</u></p> <p>Regularly enrolled students whose parents have moved out of the school district may be permitted to finish the school year.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>OTHER NONRESIDENT STUDENTS</u></p> <p>A nonresident student may be admitted to district schools without payment of tuition where attendance is justified on the grounds that the student.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lives full-time and not just for the school year with district residents who have assumed legal dependency or guardianship or residential support of the student. 	<p>SC 1316, 2561</p> <p>SC 1305</p> <p>SC 1306-9 Title 22 Sec. 11.18</p> <p>SC 1316</p> <p>SC 1316</p> <p>SC 1302 Title 22 Sec. 11.19</p>

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4. Delegation of Responsibility	<p>The Administrative Director or designee shall follow procedures for the enrollment of nonresident children which:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Admit such students only on proper application and submission of required documentation by the parent or guardian. • Verify claims of residency. • Do not exclude any eligible student on the basis of race, creed, color, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, or handicap/disability. • Deny admission where the educational facilities or program maintained for district students is inadequate to meet the needs of the applicant. • Make continued enrollment of any nonresident student contingent upon maintaining established standards of attendance, discipline and academics. <p><u>THE ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR SHALL</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recommend to the Joint Operating Committee for its approval the admission of qualified applicants. • Report to the Joint Operating Committee for its information the enrollment of each nonresident. 	<p>Pol. 103</p> <p>School Code 501, 502, 1301, 1302, 1305, 1306-9, 1306.2, 1310, 1316, 1609, 2503, 2561 PA Code Title 22 Sec. 11.18, 11.19</p>
