	216. STUDENT DISCIPLINE	
<p>1. Purpose</p> <p>2. Authority</p>	<p>The Joint Operating Committee finds that student conduct is closely related to learning. An effective educational program requires a safe and orderly school environment.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee shall establish fair and reasonable rules and regulations regarding the conduct and department of all students in the school (center) during the time they are under the supervision of the school (center), or at any time while on school property, while present at school-sponsored activities, and while traveling to or from school and school-sponsored activities.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee shall adopt a Code of Student Conduct to govern student behavior.</p> <p>Each student must adhere to Joint Operating Committee policies and the Code of Student Conduct governing school discipline.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Off-Campus Activities</u></p> <p>This policy shall also apply to student conduct that occurs off school property and would violate the Code of Student Conduct if:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. There is a nexus between the proximity of timing of the conduct in relation to the student’s attendance at school or school-sponsored activities. 2. The student is a member of an extracurricular activity and has been notified that particular off-campus conduct could result in exclusion from such activities. 3. Student expression or conduct materially and substantially disrupts the operations of the school (center), or the administration reasonably anticipates that the express or conduct is likely to materially and substantially disrupt the operations of the school (center.) 4. The conduct has a direct nexus to attendance at school or a school-sponsored activity, such as an agreement to complete a transaction outside of school that would violate the Code of Student Conduct. 5.
