Outside of school, he works part time at Ron's Truck Repair and Spotlight Holsteins.

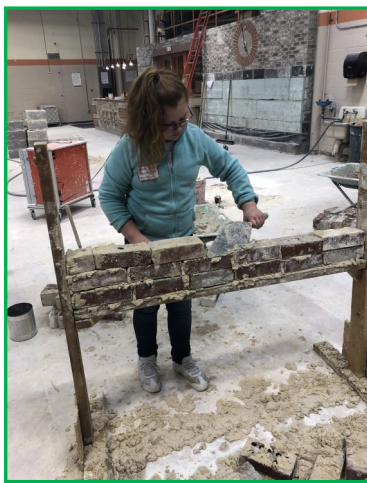
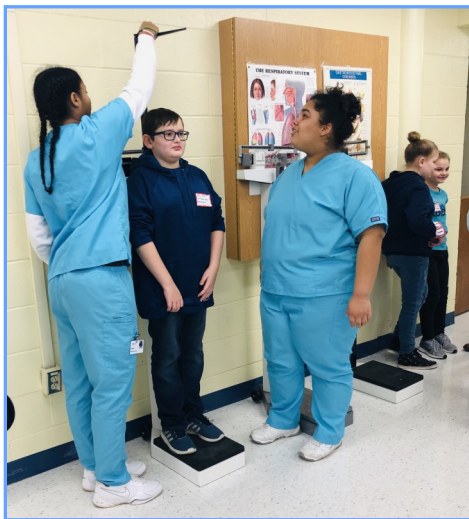
