► Crystal Hower, Instructional Aide, Special Populations

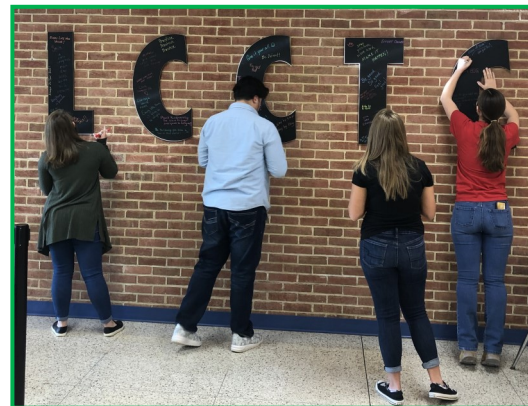

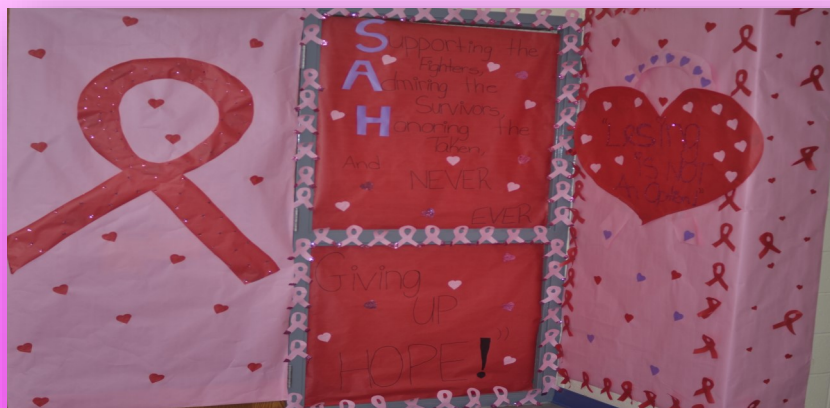

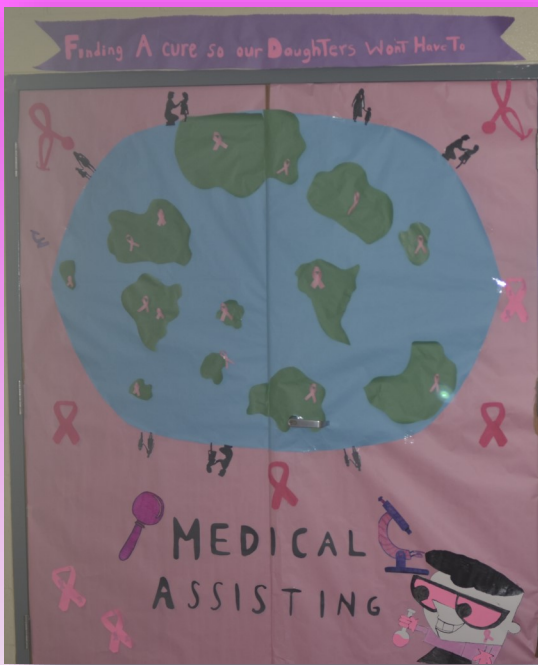
