

BR Kreider & Sons Excavation Demonstration

A Hands-On Learning Experience for Students

In an exciting and educational collaboration, BR Kreider & Sons, a local excavation company, recently visited our Career and Technology Center to give students a hands-on experience with heavy machinery. This skill-based event allowed students to try their hand at operating two mini-excavators; showcasing the expertise needed for employment in the excavation industry.

The Excavator Rodeo

The event, known as the "Excavator Rodeo," featured a skill test in which students operated the excavators to pick up three sports balls—softball, football, and soccer ball—placed atop orange emergency cones. Once the balls were lifted by the excavator bucket, students had to drop them into a tire on the ground, testing their ability to handle the machinery with precision.

The test was designed to mimic the skills required for working with equipment at BR Kreider & Sons, while also demonstrating the importance of safety in excavation. The event aimed not only to provide valuable hands-on training but also to introduce students to potential career opportunities in the field of excavation and heavy equipment operation.

A Focus on Safety and Real-World Experience

Heath Kreiser, a representative from BR Kreider & Sons, led the demonstration. As he instructed students on the operation of the excavators, Heath also shared insights into the day-to-day work of the company, highlighting the installation of water and sewer lines, as well as the critical need for awareness of underground materials such as fiber optic cables and gas lines. Throughout the day, Heath emphasized safety; stressing that the company's number one goal is to ensure that all workers return home safely at the end of each day. This focus on safety was a key takeaway for students, as it is essential in any heavy equipment operation.

Involvement Across Disciplines

Students from a variety of programs participated in the event, including juniors and seniors from Carpentry, Diesel, Electrical, Plumbing, Landscaping, and Masonry. This diverse group had the opportunity to operate the miniexcavators, and even a few instructors joined in to try their hand at the machines.

Since our school does not currently offer a heavy equipment program, this event provided students with exposure to a closely related field; offering them a glimpse of what a career in excavation could look like. The event not only broadened their career possibilities but also reinforced the value of practical, hands-on learning experiences.

A Lasting Impact: Job Shadow Opportunity

The hands-on experience didn't end with the demonstration. The event sparked significant interest among students, leading to further opportunities for career exploration. One such example is Rylan Flowers, a student from our Plumbing program. Inspired by the demonstration, Rylan took the next step and arranged for a job shadowing opportunity with BR Kreider & Sons.

Thanks to Heath Kreiser's support, Rylan was able to spend a day working alongside the company's professionals, operating various types of heavy equipment. This experience gave Rylan a firsthand look at the diverse nature of sitework; showing him how different pieces of heavy equipment are used in tandem to complete large-scale excavation projects. It was an invaluable opportunity for Rylan to understand the intricacies of site work and how his plumbing skills could complement a career in heavy equipment operation.

A Valuable Career Opportunity

For many students, this event opened the door to a potential career in excavation and heavy equipment operation. By learning about the necessary skills and safety protocols, they were better prepared to pursue future job opportunities with BR Kreider & Sons or similar companies. It's clear that events like this help bridge the gap between education and real-world careers, giving students an edge in the competitive workforce.


Cleona Elementary School Career Day




