This summer, Lebanon County CTC staff dedicated their time to volunteering with the Power Packs Project, a program committed to helping families facing food insecurity. Through this experience, our staff saw firsthand the growing need in our community and recognized the importance of expanding our efforts to better serve our students and their families.

As a result, Lebanon County CTC is proud to announce that we will now serve as a distribution site for Power Packs during the school year. Each week, staff members will rotate to volunteer their time to ensure that families receive the support they need.

The Power Packs Project provides families with the ingredients and recipes to prepare an easy, nutritious weekend meal when school breakfast and lunch are unavailable. In addition to the meal kit, families receive staple items such as cereal, peanut butter, fresh fruits, and vegetables.

By working together, Lebanon County CTC and the Power Packs Project aim to ease the burden of food insecurity for students and families in our community. We are grateful for the opportunity to partner in this meaningful work and look forward to continuing to serve our families throughout the year.

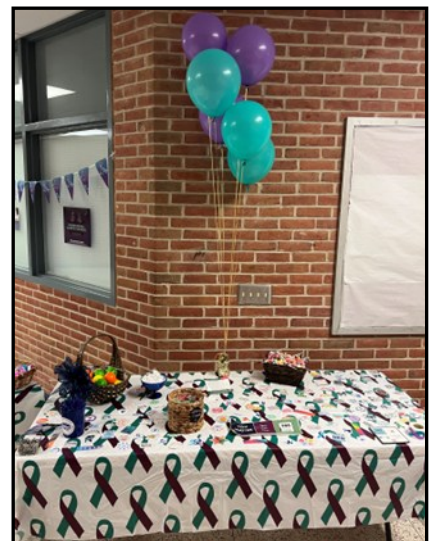
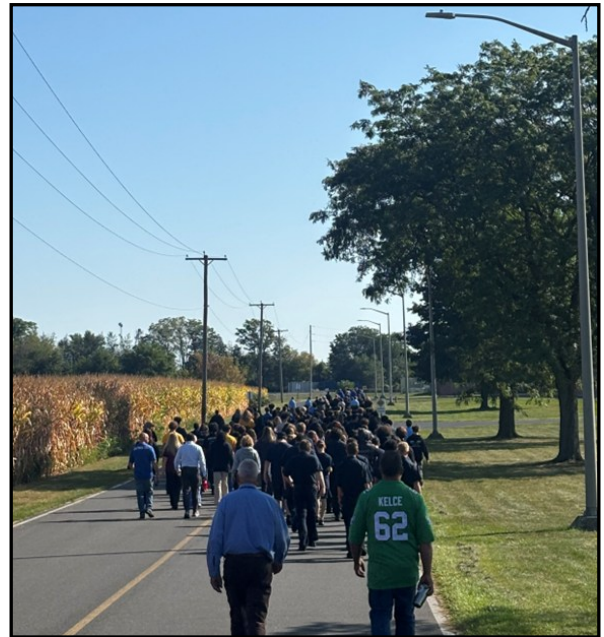
Suicide Prevention Week

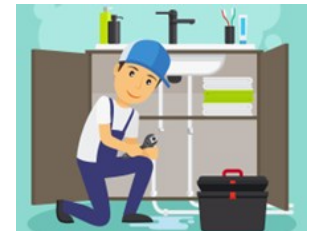
**Travis Furmanski, CL,
