126. STUDENT AWARDS AND RECOGNITION PROGRAMS	
1. Awards	<p>1. Acceptance of Awards/Information Assistance with Awards.</p> <p>Regardless of whether the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center is accepting an award for our Awards Program or simply informing students of the availability of a particular award, the criteria that is established to apply for that award must be such that it is available to anyone without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.</p> <p>Any award that does not meet the bias free criteria may not be accepted or promoted by the CTC.</p> <p>2. Financial Assistance information must be translated for national origin minority persons in their primary language.</p> <p>Utilize the following procedures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Identify the particular community of national origin. b. If a local interpreter is available, have them translate the financial assistance announcements for the student(s). A copy will be retained in the counselor's file. c. If a local interpreter is not available, the counselor will locate and secure the services necessary to have an appropriate translation of the financial assistance made.
2. Honor Roll	<p>Business and industry have found that their most successful employees are individuals who have excelled in both knowledge and skill areas. The Lebanon County Career and Technology Center wishes to award special honor status to those outstanding students who excel in both areas.</p> <p>A student must meet the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Course letter grade for CTC instructional area and academic courses must be an "A". 2. Student must possess at least a 3.0 grade point average in home school academic subjects with no grades lower than a "C" for the same marking period.

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<p>3. Guidelines</p>	<p>3.
