223. STUDENTS AND THE POLICE	
<p>1. Purpose</p> <p>2. Authority</p>	<p>The Joint Operating Committee recognizes that compulsory attendance laws impose on them the custodianship of the public school children of the participating schools while they are in attendance at the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center.</p> <p>When police request permission to interrogate a student at school, the Assistant Principal shall inform the Director; determine why such interrogation could not occur at the student's home; and attempt to inform the student's parents or guardian.</p> <p>Whenever the Assistant Principal or designee has determined that the police have a legitimate purpose in interrogating a student within the confines of the school, the Assistant Principal or his/her designee shall be present throughout the proceedings.</p> <p>When the police request permission to arrest a student at school, the Assistant Principal shall inform the Director, to the degree possible, determine why such arrest could not be made at the student's home; attempt to inform the student's parents; and request and inspect the arrest warrant.</p> <p>No student shall be released to police authorities without proper warrant, appropriate evidence or written parental permission, except in the event of an emergency or for the protection of life or property as determined by the Assistant Principal or his/her designee.</p>
