For a Fundraiser





Cornwall Manor Retirement Community was founded in 1949 by a group of United Methodist Clergy and Laymen from the Philadelphia Conference of The United Methodist Church (now the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference) as a home for retired United Methodist clergy and their families.

Cornwall Manor's many historic buildings include the **Buckingham Mansion**, built circa 1773 and which has been renovated to include seven residential apartments, a reading room and a music room; a former Carriage House, which now serves as a residential building and fitness center; and a former Paymaster's Building, which is now a resident art studio and meeting area. The combination of these, along with a state-of-the-art Wellness Center and swimming pool, and houses and apartment buildings of varying styles, truly result in a campus look and feel.



This mansion was comprised of over 100 hours of detailed construction. The mansion is completely edible, and no Styrofoam or card board used in its assemble.

The gingerbread bread is covered in fondant, royal icing and white chocolate. The most unique characteristic feature of the mansion is its 3 ½ story offset tower adorned with numerous windows and balconies. More than 3,282 shingles were used in the roof and the red fondant welcome mat and broom finish off the structure.

South Lebanon fourth grade students came to the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center on December 8, 2017, for a field trip about Career Exploration.



We will be providing tours again to Elementary and Middle School students the first week of May.










The alumni came from a variety of universities and colleges, such as, Penn State University, Penn College, Central Penn College, Alvernia University, Slippery Rock University and West Virginia University. and are now pursuing careers in the fitness industry. Hanna Seyfert, Sports Therapy Instructor, said of the event, "It was exciting for me to see what career and educational paths each of the students ultimately decided to take. Current student, Keishla Garcia (Cedar Crest High School) stated, "I think it was awesome to see that they came right out of this class and are taking their education to a further level. You can definitely tell that they have a passion for what they are learning."

Mrs. Seyfert stated that she plans to make Alumni Day an annual event. She believes that keeping a connection between our past and future will only strengthen the Sports Therapy Sciences program and create opportunities for both the current and future alumni.
