Dee Cook, Job Trainer, established co-op and internships for many students

The 2017-2018 school year has been successful for many senior students and a banner year for new business partner connections. Within the first quarter, there were five new business partners that supported co-op opportunities and one returning partner. Many of the employer sites began with short-term Internships. By the end of the year, there were three returning partners that became established in the past two years and one new site offering Internships. Internships have proven to be vital in guiding our students' decisions to the future as mentors take a personal interest in each individual.

To begin with the paid experiences or co-op's, the first new business to come on board was Iron Valley Golf Course (owned by Byler holdings which is a company that toured and presented here last year). They hosted an Automotive Technology student, Nick Schiavoni, in the maintenance garage. Nick worked on various types of vehicles and equipment, everything from small gas engines to company fleet vehicles. He also received some experience in welding. Manada Construction continues to host Hunter Brubaker one day a week where he does various duties from operating heavy equipment to maintenance. Manada Construction will be his career. Messick Farm Equipment began a partnership and Diesel Technology student Nathan Arndt segued with a co-op experience. They recently hired him, and Nathan plans on continuing with Messick for his career. Nathan spends most of his days working on riding mowers and garden tractors but is getting some experience working on larger implements. The second half of the year, Messick took on Diesel student Evan Wallace and recently hired him as well. Evan has been exposed to various types of agricultural equipment and has had some experience with the field repair team. Diamond Toyota supported Automotive Technology student, Derrick Church, as a tire and lube technician. They recently officially hired him and will be sending him to a post-secondary school to be a certified Toyota Technician. Ciocca Honda Body Shop hired Auto Body Technology student Jason Bauman. Jason has done various duties dealing mainly with collision repair; he will be moving up with the company already and getting his own designated work area. Barton's Auto Body in Mount Joy supported Auto Body student David Webster with a co-op and recently hired him. David does various tasks from prepping to painting for collision repair. Pennsy Supply also partnered for the third year in a row – this time at a different location – Paxton Street in Harrisburg where Diesel Technology student, Dominick Mazzocca, began working in the maintenance garage repairing and maintaining various types of large vehicles. He is well on his way to move

up in his career with the company. The second quarter, new acquaintances were made beginning with one employer, Lebanon Valley Farms Disposal. Diesel student, Michael Zohner, was supported with a co-op opportunity in the maintenance garage. Michael worked with a mentor learning various repairs on trash hauling vehicles. Another new partner, Colours of Lebanon, became a new host co-op opportunity; Auto Body student, Nick Kreiser, gained more in-depth experience with auto paint. He too became gainfully employed.

New Internship sites and returning sites provided a real-world hands-on experience with mentors that helped to shape decisions for future endeavors. Experiences while an intern are unpaid. Detail Technologies in Manheim supported Auto Body student, Dallas Heblow, experience with prep and finishing body work done on cars that were headed for the auction. Fort Indiantown Gap also came through with a signed agreement for the third year in a row willing to host Internships for students in Welding, HVAC, Electrical, Carpentry, Diesel and Automotive Technologies. This site hired one of our Carpentry students, Casey McCluskey, three years ago; he set the pathway for the partnership to continue. Schreiber Pediatrics opened the door for the second year for Internships working with preschool children. Sports Therapy student, Casey Boyer, participated all year long, one day a week. She was able to assist in the classroom and participate in a portion of the occupational and physical therapy activities. This experience clarified her choice to get on a nursing career path in pediatrics. Wellspan Good Samaritan Hospital also continued to partner with Internship opportunities; this time in the Physical Therapy department. Kayleigh Leedy was given the opportunity to participate and have a first-hand look at in-hospital acute and post-operative physical therapy. Beginning with the second quarter, there were newly partnered employers that came to the CTC and presented in the Career Center, toured relevant programs and provided information on applying to entry level, yet solid growth opportunities. Camp Hill State Prison brought a speaking team to students from the Health Careers and Law Enforcement programs for them to learn what a day in the life of various positions within the State Prison System is like. They answered questions about how the state prison system works as well as questions regarding residents they house. They also provided information on the opportunity to go into a State position right out of high school. A team of 6 staff members of Masonic Village came here to gain knowledge of our programs and how they could assist in hosting Internships on their vast campus. After 5 months of collaborating, a contract

and agreement were signed to open the door to students in programs connected to building maintenance and landscape to participate in internships. Even though it was in the last weeks of school, two students participated with mentors to gain experience in both areas. Landscape Technology student, Cole Jamison, had a chance to get experience in painting and drywalling as well as landscape and grounds maintenance. HVAC/Plumbing student, Brandon Brown, also gained a great deal of experience for the short time period, working with mentors on various projects across the 1,000 acre village. Both students attended new employee orientations and were given information on how to monitor and apply for career opportunities. Because this village is comprised of mainly a residential facility for aging and special needs, there will be a wide range of Internship opportunities to offer to many of our students in the future years. Some other new associations were made for internship sites. Dental Assistant, Xavier Pedraza, is currently interning (and being paid through the IU 13 WIOA program) at Lebanon Ridge Health Center. He will be offered employment. Dental Assistant, Laquasha Stith, participated in an internship at Aspen Dental as a dental assistant. Health Careers Technology student, Cherie Luzon, interned at Lebanon Pain Relief Center learning various duties associated with medical assisting. Networking also paid off in the second half of the year by bringing in employers that visited programs and eventually hired students. A body shop representative from Faulkner of Harrisburg came in to visit several programs associated with a car dealership and opened the door for Auto Body student, Airam Suarez. He has been hired and is working in the body shop on Paxton Street; he has the opportunity and will receive more certifications associated with the industry. A representative from Freightliner of Harrisburg toured Auto Body and Diesel Technology and guaranteed an interview and decent starting wage to young individuals. Last year, they hired adult Auto Body student, Josh Morales; this provided a great segue to expand and network with them again. After earlier networking with Cummins of Harrisburg, they offered to come in to present to students and hopefully recruit. Precision Landscape reached out to find an employee they could begin early in the season. Landscape student, Brandon Jagers, became their new employee. After earlier networking, two representatives from Davis Landscape came into the Career Center and presented opportunities to several students from a few different programs.

They offered an attractive starting rate and benefits package. Two Landscape students, Cody Riegle and Brandon Sheffy, became employees as well as Industrial Machine student, Luis Merrero; they all are working in the Hershey area. After earlier networking, two representatives from Davis Landscape came into the Career Center and presented opportunities to several students from a few different programs.

A representative from B. R. Kreider and Sons came here in the last quarter and presented several opportunities that included automotive, diesel, welding, electrical, HVAC, and equipment operators. He did on-the-spot applications and basic informal interviews. Landscape student, Timothy Petruchev, was hired and is in the process of getting certifications to run various heavy equipment machinery.

The most recent new business partner is Builder's Specialty in Elizabethtown. They first reached out earlier in 2018, but only held a more in-depth meeting in early May. Because of the

timing, there were few candidates available, however, one individual was a good fit. Electromechanical student Michael Villa. He will begin working June 18 and will be installing and maintaining equipment and accessories in school buildings. This will require travel within a broad area of the east coast.

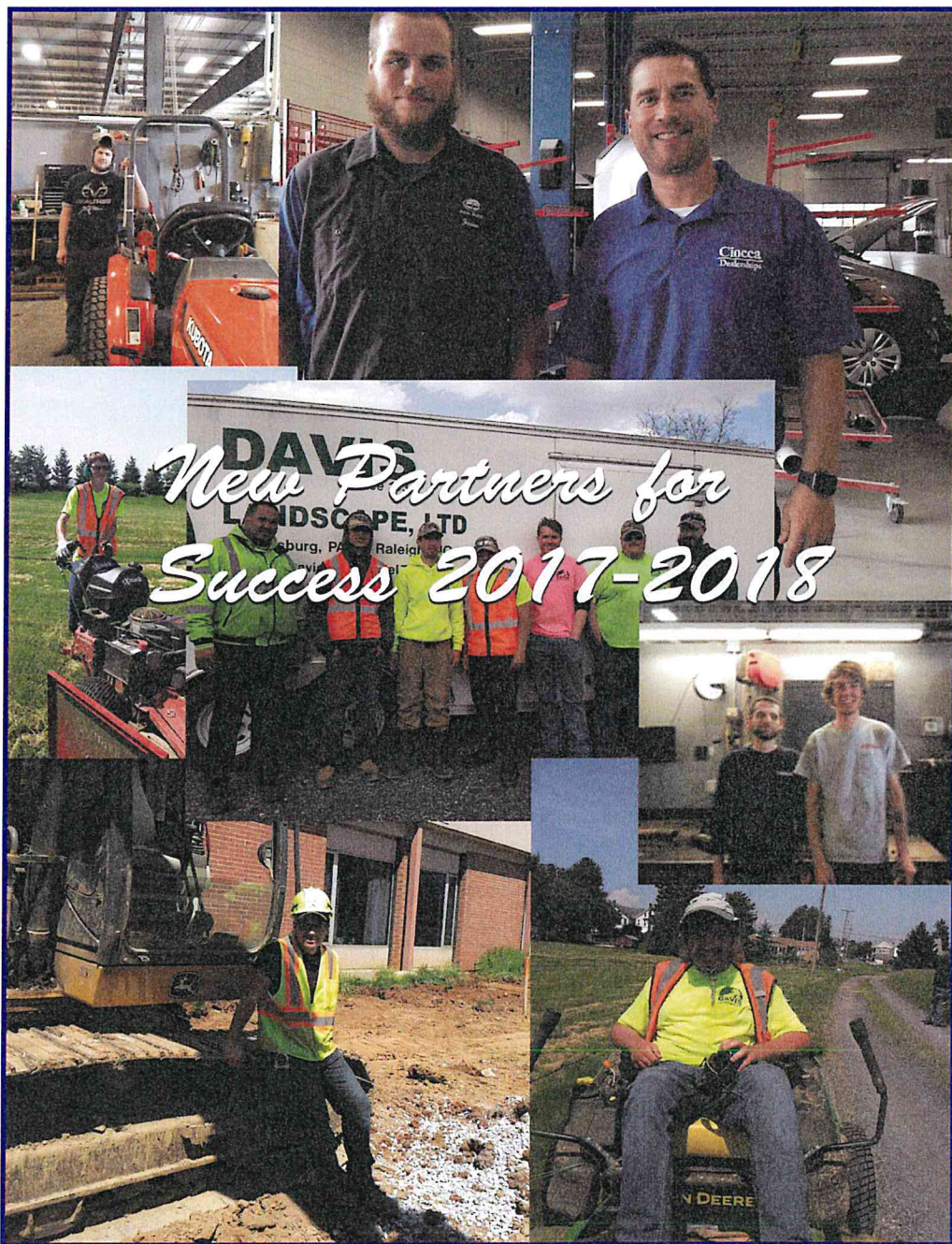
Lastly, a vitally important partnership that has proven to be an essential part of many students' days, partnering with Central PA Foodbank. This partnership allowed the existing breakfast club to expand and offer a well-rounded "grab and go".

Students had the options of milk, cereal, juice, protein and fresh or canned fruit daily. Partnering with the food bank allowed the set budget to feed an average of 61 students a day for the year; feeding as many as 102 in one day and totaling around 10,588 breakfasts served for the year. Numerous trips to the food bank netted anywhere from 100 to over 300 pounds of food at a minimal cost to be brought back to the CTC for this program.

The 2017-18 school year was very active with many students participating in the school-to-work program. A total of 130 students participated in either clinical, cooperative education, internship or job shadowing opportunities. These experiences included the Medical Assistant students shadowing in various departments within the Good Samaritan Health System and participating in clinical experiences in several health facilities throughout Lebanon County. The Health Careers Technology students performed their clinical experiences at Stone Ridge Retirement Village. Our Dental Assistant students participated in clinical at several dentist offices in the local area. Additionally, there were 36 different cooperative education experiences during this school year; several of these students will continue employment with their cooperative education employers.

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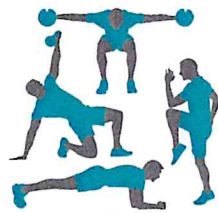
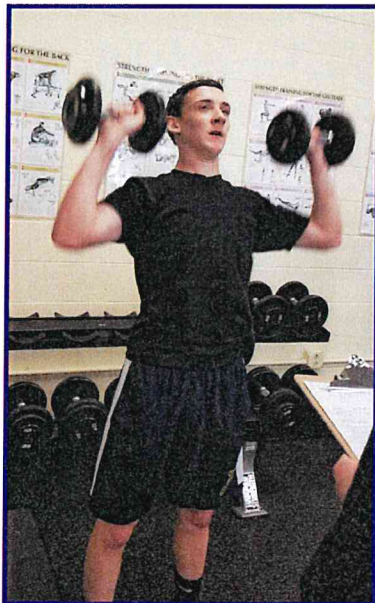

Sports Therapy and Law Enforcement Collaborate for Physical Fitness Training

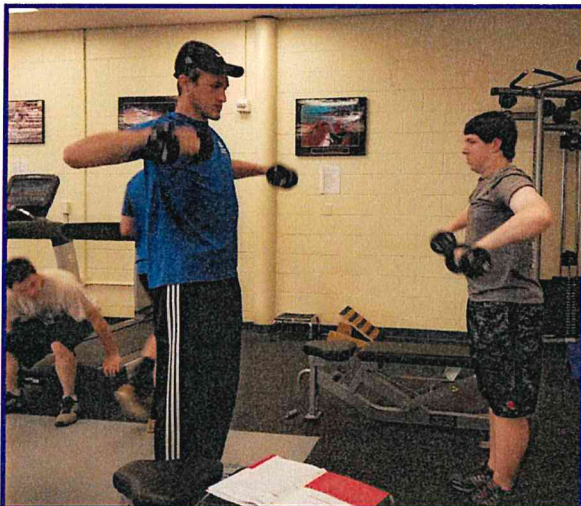


This year Sports Therapy Sciences and Law Enforcement worked together to complete differing program tasks from each of their respective programs on fitness training. Earlier this spring the collaboration started with students from Sports Therapy taking their Law Enforcement clients through pre-exercise tests and screenings. Health status and behavior questionnaires were delivered and discussed with each client to determine if the student could participate and if there needed to be any modifications. Each client then went through vital signs and body composition screenings as well as exercise testing. Casey Boyer, Sports Therapy Sciences student from ELCO High School stated, "working with the Law Enforcement class didn't feel like an assignment to be graded because it was interesting to watch our clients be motivated to improve their test results but have fun at the same time."



Once the testing was complete, the Sports Therapy students developed different exercise programs each week following the guidelines for a specific program. The students gained experience in exercise prescription for different goals such as general fitness, hypertrophy, strength, power or endurance. The two programs trained together for 4 weeks and then performed post-training tests. Many of the students stated that they made gains even in the short period of time. One student, Chris Davis, Law Enforcement from Annville-Cleona High School was pleased with his improvements. This is what Chris had to say about the experience, "The Sports Therapy students were very knowledgeable in helping me reach my goals. The training got progressively harder. It was intense but attainable. Overall, my strength improved based on the number of push-ups performed and my cardio improved when tested in my Army training. I enjoyed working with Josh and Jack and I'm using what they taught me elsewhere."

All the instructors for the two programs could not be happier with the results of the collaboration this year. Abbey Mays, Law Enforcement Instructor stated, "I truly enjoyed watching my students strive and push themselves to meet their personal fitness goals each session. Their excitement, eagerness, and dedication to their personal training sessions was contagious!" Hanna Seyfert, Sports Therapy Sciences Instructor could not be more impressed with her students. She states, "they did a great job applying specific skills into the training sessions. The students had the opportunity to use their knowledge in a real-life career setting and excelled. I also have to compliment the Law Enforcement students. They stayed engaged and were willing to give everything presented to them a try. Their willingness made this a success." Chris Rutter, Law Enforcement Instructor was also pleased with the results. He stated, "my students found the training that was provided by Sports Therapy to be very beneficial. They enjoyed working with another program and looked forward to each session and the progress they made. I was impressed by how well this entire training program was put together. The collaboration was a huge success."



COSMETOLOGY

Cosmetology senior students are busy preparing to take the Cosmetology State Board Exam. To be eligible for the exam, students need to complete 1250 hours of cosmetology instruction and achieve passing scores for required skills. This year, students completed the NOCTI exam, Barbicide certification and are busy reviewing Milady computer reviews to prepare for the exam.

To apply, the application process is different this year and a lot more cumbersome. Students need to apply online and the process requires uploading requested documentation. Once the required information is documented, an exam date is issued. Currently the exam consists of over 100 multiple choice questions and the cost is \$130.00. When students pass the exam, a cosmetology license is issued. Once licensed the job market consists of jobs such as a hairstylist, esthetician and nail technician. Salon management, education, and ownership are also possibilities. Congratulations to those moving forward in the cosmetology field.



ELECTROMECHANICAL TECHNOLOGY



The Electromechanical Technology program was busy and exciting this year. Students worked on various projects throughout the school, helping to keep the inner workings of the school functioning properly and in peak operation. Industry professionals came to the CTC to speak with the students regarding what to expect in the field, as well as observe them working on live projects. The students then had the opportunity to go to a local business and observe them performing a rebuild of equipment used to make glass vials. This year was the first year that any students in the program competed in SkillsUSA competitions. The competitions were related to electronics technology, industrial motor controls, and mechatronics. Tory Eberly received bronze in districts and moved on to states. Nick White and Christopher Habowski won silver in the state competition. Most of the students who were looking for employment in the field interviewed and received offers for positions related to the field of study. Others who were planning on attending college or further education were all accepted in various programs such as Biomedical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, and Mechanical Engineering. The Electromechanical Technology program continues to grow and succeed, allowing the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center to provide local industry with exceptional candidates for open positions in their companies.

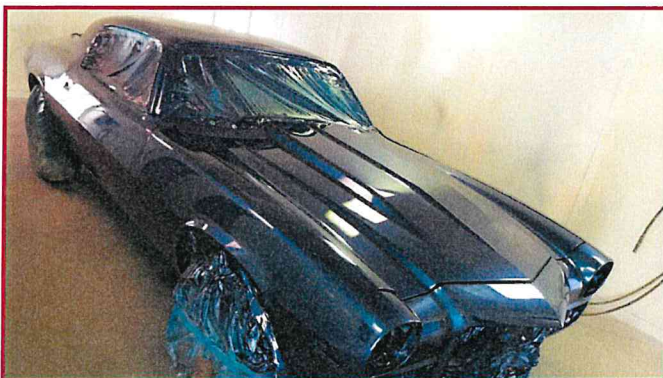
PM CLASS

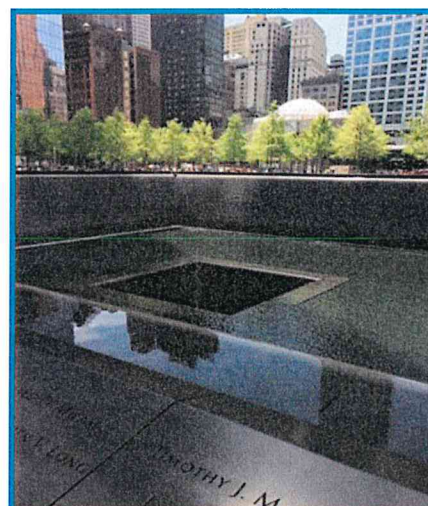
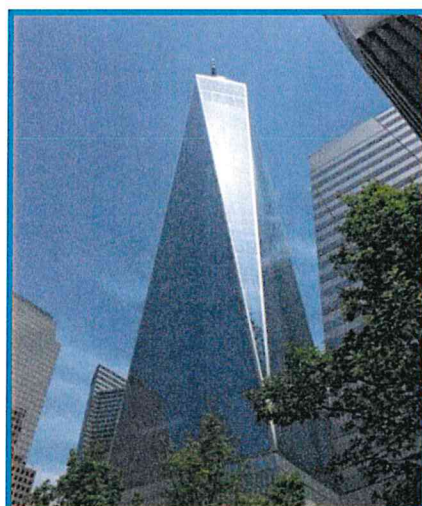
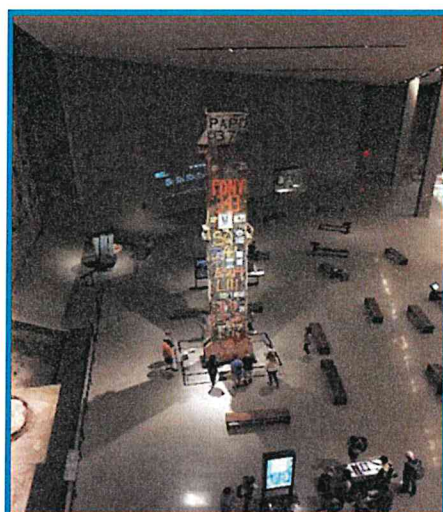

May 22 -HCT, MA, STS and Law Enforcement seniors visited the 9/11 Memorial and Museum. It was a great educational experience.

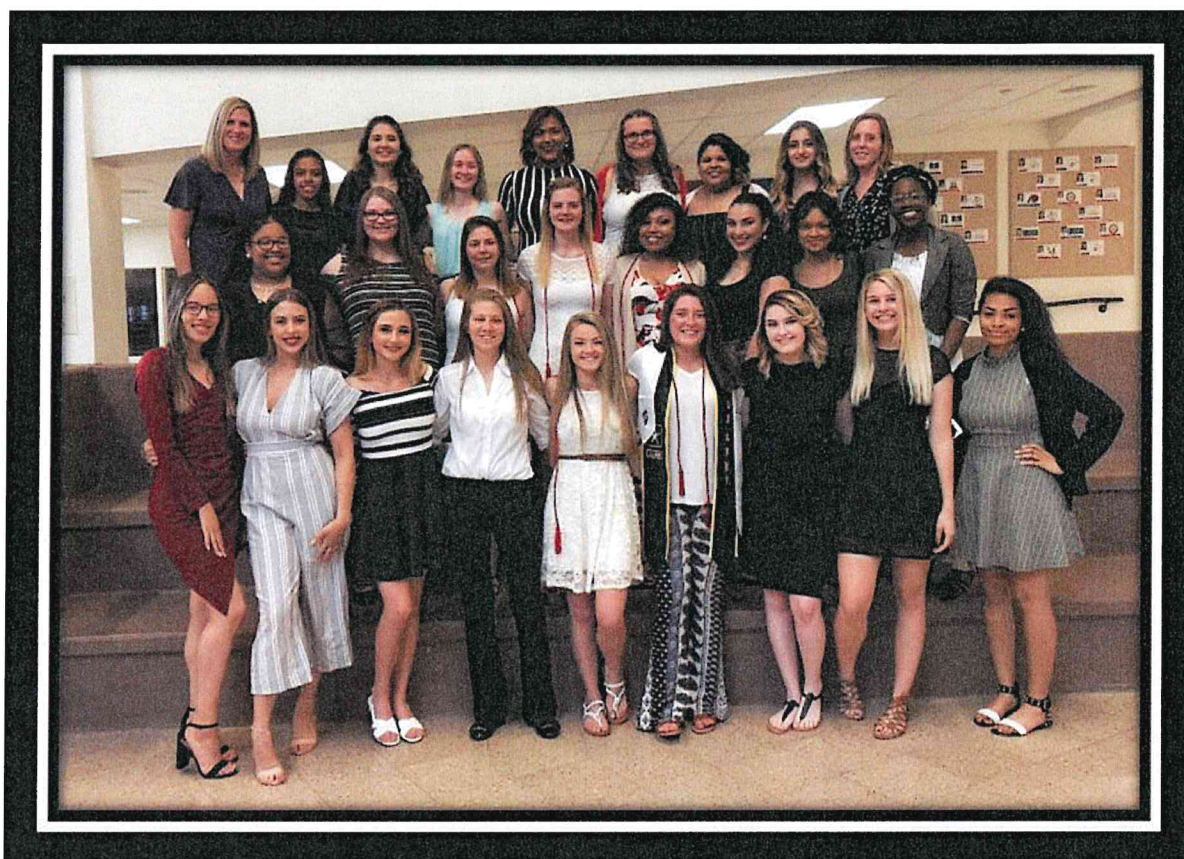

New This Year For Visitors . . . School Gate Guardian

The Lebanon County Career and Technology Center has installed a visitor management software system. School Gate Guardian requires all visitors to present a valid driver's license or other state-issued identification upon arrival at the door. The ID will be scanned and checked. Visitors who have been cleared will receive a printed ID badge that includes their photo and name. The badge is self-expiring, meaning within 12 hours of receipt, the word "VOID" will bleed through to the front so the badge cannot be reused. The process to scan an ID, run the check and print a badge takes about 30 seconds to complete.
