
2019 Fashion Show






Children's Dental Health Month







The students in the dental assistant class played interactive games with the children and read books to them. They had fun learning about the proper techniques of brushing and flossing. The children really enjoyed the game "Good Food and Bad Food". We gave them a snack of apples and popcorn and explained to them why those foods were good for their teeth. This was a fun and exciting time for the Dental Assistant class to serve the community.











Lesson 1: How to BRUSH

- Place the toothbrush at a 45° angle along the gum line. Move the toothbrush in a back and forth motion, and repeat for each tooth.
- Brush the inside surface of each tooth, using the same back and forth technique.
- Brush the chewing surface (top) of each tooth.
- Use tip of brush to brush behind each tooth — front and back, top and bottom and up and down strokes.
- Be sure to brush your tongue to remove odorcausing bacteria.

Lesson 2: How to FLOSS

- Pull 18 to 24 inches of dental floss from the floss dispenser.
- Wrap the ends of the floss around your index and middle fingers.
- Hold the floss tightly around each tooth in a C shape; move the floss back and forth in a push-pull motion and up and down against the side of each tooth.
