

Dental is getting down to business with discovering the procedures of the dental assistant, and pouring models of the teeth to study.
























# REMINDER For Visitors . . . School Gate Guardian



The Lebanon County Career and Technology Center recently installed a visitor management software system.

School Gate Guardian requires all visitors to present a valid driver's license or other state-issued identification upon arrival at the door. The ID will be scanned and checked. Visitors who have been cleared will receive a printed ID badge that includes their photo and name. The badge is self-expiring, meaning within 12 hours of receipt, the word "VOID" will bleed through to the front so the badge cannot be reused. The process to scan an ID, run the check and print a badge takes about 30 seconds to complete.
