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#### **Precision Machining Technology's NASA Project**

On January 5, 2022, students from the Precision Machining Technology program took part in a kickoff meeting with Dr. Florence Gold, NASA HUNCH Implementation Project Manager. HUNCH's (High school students United with NASA to Create Hardware) mission is to empower and inspire students through a project-based learning program where students learn 21st century skills and have the opportunity to design and/or fabricate real world valued products for NASA.

The Precision Machining Technology program has been selected to produce a few key components that will ultimately be used on the ISS (International Space Station). The initial meeting is the first of many. The students and Mr. Tanger, Instructor of the Precision Machining Technology program, will learn what it takes to produce parts for flight. The students learned what the components are, how they are used, and the level of detail required. In future meetings, students will be taught how to properly inspect and document the production of parts and ultimately be given the "stamp of approval" to inspect parts for the Johnson Space Center located in Houston, Texas.

Students in the Precision Machining Technology program are tasked with developing a manufacturing plan, programs, fixtures, and inspection plan to produce the parts required. Once parts are approved locally, they will be shipped to Johnson Space Center where they will again be inspected and if found to be correct, will be assembled into complete units and ultimately find a home aboard the ISS.
