The Lebanon students did very well in the competition. They earned 18 gold and two silver medals. On January 20, the LCCTC SkillsUSA chapter treated the medalists to an awards luncheon in the Hilltop Café. The students received their medals, a certificate for their portfolios, and a delicious meal. The gold medalists, along with five additional students from the Media Communications class, are now eligible to compete in the SkillsUSA Pennsylvania Conference and Championships in April at the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center, the Lebanon Expo Center, and various CTCs in the Central Pennsylvania area.

CTSOs offer students innovative programming, authentic leadership experiences and business and community opportunities at the school, state, and national levels.

The Lebanon County Career and Technology Center offers four different student organizations: SkillsUSA, Health Occupations Students of American (HOSA), Lebanon County Builder's Association Student Chapter, and National Technical Honor Society (NTHS).





SkillsUSA is a partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. They help each student excel. A nonprofit national education association, SkillsUSA serves middle-school, high-school and college/postsecondary students preparing for careers in trade, technical and skilled service occupations.

The mission statement is SkillsUSA empowers its members to become world-class workers, leaders, and responsible American citizens. We improve the quality of our nation's future skilled workforce through the development of SkillsUSA Framework skills that include personal, workplace and technical skills grounded in academics. Our vision is to produce the most highly skilled workforce in the world, providing every member the opportunity for career success.

SkillsUSA serves more than 333,527 students and instructors annually. This includes 19,019 instructors who join as professional members. Including alumni, SkillsUSA membership totals over 394,000. SkillsUSA has served nearly 14 million annual members cumulatively since 1965 and is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Labor as a successful model of employer-driven workforce development.

They successfully ran the schools largest Chicken BBQ sale, selling more than 1,400 chicken meals in the fall. SkillsUSA will be hosting another Chicken BBQ sale on April 12th. They have ongoing sales of beef sticks along with Santa and cupid grams. On January 14th, they hosted the District 5 SkillsUSA competition and are currently planning for the State competition on April 6, 7, 8 at the Hershey Lodge.









The mission of HOSA is to empower HOSA-Future Health Professionals to become leaders in the global health community through education, collaboration, and experience. Incorporating HOSA into the classroom helps students build leadership skills, teamwork and critical thinking skills that can help the student as they begin their future. HCT HOSA does many community service projects throughout the year. During the month of October, HCT transformed their classroom into a "Haunted Classroom". The money raised was donated to the Lebanon County Breast Cancer Coalition.

On January 21, 2022, HCT HOSA sponsored a blood drive with the Central Pennsylvania Blood Bank. 30 pints of blood were collected which can help up to 90 people. A second blood drive will be held in April.

Community service projects help the HOSA student give back and provide them an opportunity to be part of the planning and execution of the project. HOSA is a big part of the HCT classroom and we are proud of the students and their commitment to healthcare.
