Students in the Practical Nursing Program are responsible for the comprehensive costs of the program including:

- Pre-Admission Testing
- All related expenses: medical examination, background checks, CPR certification, uniforms*, shoes, books, supplies and graduation expenses of a uniform, cap, pin, and diploma.

*Uniforms are purchased directly from the school supplier online.

The Practical Nurse Program combines classroom study with supervised clinical practice in a variety of nursing fundamentals from providing basic bedside care to measuring and recording vital signs and dressing wounds. This career program prepares students for advance opportunities in an LPN to RN bridge program.

What is Practical Nursing?

On a typical day, a Practical Nurse is asked to:

- Provide bedside care
- Measure and record vital signs such as temperature,
 blood pressure, and respiration
- Dress wounds
- Prepare and administer medication
- Help bathe, dress and feed patients

Requirements for Admission

The Practical Nursing Program is open to Pennsylvania residents with a high school diploma or an equivalent Pennsylvania GED. Credit for previous experience and education related to nursing may be obtained through challenge exams. All applicants must achieve satisfactory scores on the pre-admission testing.

Other requirements include:

- Complete an online application
- Pre-admission test Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) test
- Educational transcripts from high school and post-secondary schooling
- Pre-admission physical exam, including a urine drug screen and required vaccinations
- CPR certification
- PA State Police Request for Criminal Record Check
- PA Child Abuse History Clearance
- FBI Fingerprint

NOTE: This Program is subject to a Drug Prevention Program and a Campus Security Act.

Important Information on the Practical Nursing Program Admission Process

- 1. Submit an application www.lcctc.edu > Programs/ Curriculums > Practical Nursing > Application > Access Application
- 2. Take the pre-admission TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) test. This test consists of 170 four-option, multiple choice questions on Reading, Science, Mathematics, English, and language usage. This test will be scheduled once the application is received. A score of 50 is required.
- **3.** Submit all transcripts and other required information upon notification of passing pre-admission testing.
- **4.** Attend the Mandatory Pre-Admission Session.
