#### The following is from Chef Leiss:

A little bit about how @farm2chefstable became Farm2ChefsTable and where it all started. The last Cornucopia Dinner I had the pleasure of cooking for one of my first chef mentors Robert Corle Jr from high school. It was an amazing opportunity, slightly nerve racking to show him what 18 years in the making has fruition into thus far with his encouragement when I was merely a young lad in his classroom kitchen and very humbling all at the same time!

Although this only seems very much like the beginning of a new chapter in my book of life, it was great to hear his words of encouragement again to keep pushing for there are bigger and greater things ahead. Growing into a chef... Over years of cooking for my family, I read cookbooks like they were culinary adventure novels. These books,

along with a passion for cooking with my family, led to my first cooking job at age 14, working alongside my mother at the restaurant she ran. Shortly after that, I began working for Charlie Gipe, a CIA alumnus in Hershey, Pennsylvania.
