

#### **CTC Competed at the Lebanon County Builders Show**

Students from the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center recently participated in a hands-on competition at the Lebanon County Builders Show, where three teams competed to build mockups judged by industry professionals. Each team consisted of a mason, a carpenter, a plumber, and an electrician. They had around 10 hours to complete their projects. The goal of the event was to determine which team would move on to represent our school in a district competition at SkillsUSA next year, with potential advancement to state and national levels.

The competition was particularly impressive because all participants were juniors who had only been training in their respective trades for a few months. Instructors expressed pride in their students, highlighting not only their technical skills but also their willingness to support each other despite the competitive setting. Students who weren't selected for the final teams still contributed by assisting with preparation work in the classroom. This collaborative effort helped reinforce both trade skills and teamwork.

Beyond refining their hands-on abilities, students gained experience by working across different disciplines, which mirrors real-world job site collaboration. Initially, some were hesitant due to their lack of experience, but instructors encouraged them to step out of their comfort zones. In the end, the event served as both a learning opportunity and a confidence boost for the participants.

#### **FFA Speech Competition**



### Celebrating Excellence: Kevin Foster's Outstanding Achievement at the National Machining League Championship

We are thrilled to announce a remarkable accomplishment by one of our own—**Kevin Foster of Palmyra**—who has demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication in the field of precision machining.

#### A Journey of Skill and Determination

Kevin, a student in the Precision Machining Program at the Lebanon County Career and Technology Center (LCCTC), embarked on a challenging journey by participating in the inaugural **National Machining League** competition, hosted by **Project MFG**. This competition, sponsored by the **U.S. Department of Defense**, aims to elevate the next generation of highly skilled trade professionals by changing mindsets, fostering community support, and highlighting the prestige of manufacturing careers.

The competition began in October 2024, with 45 schools from across the United States entering students into the first round. Each school was permitted to submit up to three students, with only one advancing to the national stage. Kevin was selected to represent LCCTC, showcasing his exceptional talent and commitment.

#### Rising to the National Stage

In January 2025, Kevin and LCCTC received the exciting news that he was among the top 16 students nationwide invited to compete in the National Championship. The final competition took place over three days at **Southwestern Illinois College (SWIC)** in Belleville, Illinois.

The event schedule was rigorous:

- Day 1: Eight hours dedicated to programming.
- Day 2: Eight hours focused on machining.
- Day 3: Industry tours, providing competitors with insights into leading manufacturing facilities.

During the industry tours, Kevin had the opportunity to visit **Seyer Industries**, a premier aerospace company, as well as **Chelar Tool & Die** and **General Machine**. These experiences offered invaluable exposure to cuttingedge manufacturing processes and potential career pathways.


#### **Achieving National Recognition**

#### **Looking Ahead**



Valerie Leedy, CL, Dental Assistant


